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Responsibilities

- Performs diagnosis and counseling on a full range of cases that are not pre-screened. Professionally responsible for the soundness and validity of recommendations and services, but is expected to seek advice from senior specialists on unusual or uniquely complex client responses or on problems outside their area of expertise. Provides drop-in consultation to current and former foster youth students who are considering counseling.
- Develops specialized programs for current and former foster youth students. Present psychoeducational workshops and wellness programming for students.
- Provide consultation to faculty and staff regarding student concerns. Functions as a resource and may offer consultative support to CAPS staff and trainees on cases
- Gathers, analyzes, prepares, summarizes, and monitors the status and progress of individual cases and projects.
- Other duties as assigned.

Required Qualifications

- Master's degree in Social Work

Licenses/Certifications

- Current, valid license in California as a social worker, or if licensed in another state, would need to be licensed within 6 months of residence in California.

Knowledge, Skills and Abilities

- Thorough knowledge and experience with providing time-limited counseling and psychotherapy, group counseling, evaluation, diagnosis, and crisis intervention services.
- Experience with community-based interventions and trauma-informed counseling approaches.
- Advanced knowledge of multicultural and diversity issues and experience working with diverse populations.
- Thorough knowledge of applicable laws, standards, and ethics of professional conduct.

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- Highly effective written and verbal communication and interpersonal skills, including public speaking and workshop delivery.
- Ability to work in a highly collaborative manner with diverse student groups and staff members within CE3 and University Health Services.
- Ability to conduct complex analysis and develop and present recommendations and course of treatment.
- Knowledge of electronic/medical records systems.

Preferred Qualifications

- Clinical experience with current and former foster youth and child welfare system-involved communities.
- Clinical experience working with African Diaspora, Asian Pacific Islander, Latinx, or SSWANA communities.
- Experience working with first-generation, low-income, underrepresented, underserved, queer, and/or trans students of color.
- Experience creating community-based wellness resources (posters, materials, etc.) for distribution.
