The Department of Psychology in the College of Arts and Science at New York University seeks applicants for a full-time, non-tenure track teaching position in its graduate master's programs, pending final budgetary and administrative approval. This position will start January or September 2023.

The duties of the position include: 1) teaching courses in the master's psychology programs, 2) student

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advising and research/thesis mentoring, and 3) academic administration including co-creating a curriculum in clinical psychology focusing on research in mental health and psychopathology.

Qualifications

The ideal candidate will have extensive teaching experience in research focusing on clinical psychology, including clinical and experimental psychopathology and various approaches to therapy. The candidate will be advising students who are pursuing careers in academia, would like to join PsyD programs, or subsequently want to pursue other careers in the psychology of mental and physical health. The breadth and flexibility to mentor students' research across a variety of specializations in clinical psychology including both theoretical and applied perspectives of mental health is essential.

Candidates should specify their experience and knowledge of relevant research approaches in clinical psychology and psychopathology in their cover letter and CV. Any experience with academic program administration should be described as well. Candidates should express a commitment to working with students from a diverse global population. A Ph.D. in Psychology from a reputable institution of higher education is required.

Application Instructions

Applicants selected as finalists will be asked to arrange for a minimum of three professional letters of recommendation to be sent. Materials submitted must include evidence of teaching excellence in psychology, course evaluations, a letter of interest (including career goals, educational philosophy, experience mentoring student research, and/or professional practice areas), curriculum vitae, and research, scholarship, or professional work samples that demonstrate subject matter expertise and qualifications for the position as described. Diversity is an important part of NYU's mission. In your statements, please describe the ways in which your (1) scholarship, (2) teaching and mentoring, and/or (3) service and engagement demonstrate your commitment to diversity, equity, and inclusion. We are particularly interested in hearing about (1) concrete steps you have taken (or are planning to take) to foster an inclusive intellectual environment in your mentoring, in the classroom, in the department and on campus, and/or in your field more generally, and (2) how these steps connect with your broader views on the topics of diversity, equity, and inclusion.
