Job Description

The Eliot-Pearson Department of Child Study and Human Development at Tufts University is seeking a part-time Lecturer for **Spring 2023 to teach CSHD 249**. This course is design to provide graduate students and upper-level undergraduate students with an introduction to the concepts, methods, and applications of aspects of regression analysis, with a focus on its application within developmental science. The emphasis is on conducting, interpreting, and reporting the results of several regression techniques using real data sets. This class is scheduled to be taught on Thursdays from 1:20-4:20 pm.
