Whitworth University seeks a dedicated faculty member to join our Marriage and Family Therapy (MFT) program as a non-tenured, open-rank professor. This role involves teaching graduate-level MFT courses, supervising practicum and internship students, and mentoring students throughout their academic journeys. The professor will actively engage in the oversight of students' academic progress,



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including creating growth plans when necessary and serving on thesis committees.

Responsibilities extend to contributing to the strategic direction and accreditation of the MFT program, serving on the program's Advisory Board, and implementing assessment plans. This faculty member will also be involved in student recruitment, admissions committee work, and participate in departmental activities, including faculty assemblies, professional development events, and committee assignments.

Candidates are expected to engage in scholarly activities, maintaining an active presence in professional associations at the state, regional, and national levels. This role requires a commitment to upholding Whitworth's mission of academic excellence, faith integration, and service.
