professional experience, and demonstrate excellence in university teaching. This position is designed as an Assistant Professor Rank, Special-Title Series, Tenure-track, 9-month assignment. Faculty in the Special-Title Series typically teach three courses per semester and are required to engage in scholarly research and/or creative activities in their area of expertise. Review of applications begins September 1, 2025. Contingent on the successful candidate's availability, the anticipated start date is January 5, 2026, otherwise the start date is August 17, 2026.
